#### What

Promoted by the Italian NGO ProgettoMondo Mlal and approved by the European Union, this project will last 24 months and will be developed in Italy, Spain, Greece, Romania, and Sweden. Its aim is to build new tools and experiences for education to Peace, Human Rights, and sustainable development. The general frame is the effort by the EU to improve the social and civic competences of young Europeans. The estimated global cost is " 400,175.00 " .



#### Who

This project is addressed to students of secondary schools (aged 14 . 19) and to their teachers, as well as to NGOs active for Peace, Human Rights and International Co-operation that interact with schools in the field of Global Learning.

#### Why where

The economical crisis that is affecting Europe, notably the Southern countries like Italy, Spain, and Greece, as well as the Eastern nations like Romania; the urgency to reduce pollution, protect biodiversity, and fight against the global warming; increasing of immigration flows inside the Union and from Africa and Middle East: all this phenomena ask us to re-launch the culture of peace, acceptance, inclusion, and at the same time to change our life, production and consumption styles. Young people can and must be the protagonists of this change. Eduglocal+ contributes to create updated and integrated tools to facilitate their paths of personal and collective development and their orientation towards active citizenship.

#### Actions

1. To build stable alliances between schools and NGOs networks.
2. To project and test a digital Manual for Global Learning.
3. To project and test a teachers training course for Global Learning.
4. To experiment workshops with students, a part of them developed at school and the other part outdoor, through volunteering activities in the local community.
